Dear Chairman Cole and Ranking Member DeLauro:

I am requesting funding for the LA River Path (between Riverside Drive and Atlantic Boulevard) project in fiscal year 2025. The entity to receive funding for this project is Los Angeles County Metropolitan Transportation Authority (Metro), located at One Gateway Plaza, Los Angeles CA 90012. The funding would be used to bridge the longest continuous gap of 8-miles in the LA River bicycle corridor, extending the river from Elysian Valley to the City of Maywood, through downtown Los Angeles and the City of Vernon. Upon completion, the project will enhance regional connectivity by creating a seamless 32-mile traffic-separated active transportation route for walking, rolling, and cycling, stretching from the San Fernando Valley to the City of Long Beach along the LA River. The project is an appropriate use of taxpayer funds because the 34th Congressional District encompasses numerous communities categorized as Equity Focus Communities (EFCs), with a significant population residing along the project corridor facing mobility challenges. This corridor is home to higher concentrations of residents with limited mobility due to factors such as lower median household incomes (below \$61,000 per year), a larger presence of Black, Indigenous, and People of Color (BIPOC) populations, and households lacking access to personal vehicles. Consequently, the project is poised to yield considerable benefits, including improved mobility and expanded regional access to employment, educational, and recreational opportunities for underserved populations within the project area.

The project has a Federal nexus because the funding provided is for purposes authorized by 23 USC 133(b).
