As the LA City Council representative for Council District 14, I am writing to express my strong support for the Peace Officer (Ranger) Law Enforcement Pilot Project in Northeast Los Angeles Hillsides, proposed by the Mountains Recreation and Conservation Authority (MRCA) under the DOJ Office of Justice Programs, Byrne Justice Community Project Funding request for FY2024. I urge you to consider and to support funding for this request.

Illegal dumping and Off-Highway Vehicles (OHV) usage in local parkland have created hazardous conditions and caused damage to natural resources. This project will provide peace officers and staff to address these issues and promote public trust between the community and local law enforcement agencies such as Rangers. Save Elephant Hill has been at the forefront of efforts to protect and preserve Elephant Hill's urban open space including an historic advocacy campaign that resulted in MRCA acquiring land on Elephant Hill.
