The Congressional Dads Caucus was founded on January 26, 2023 by Representatives Representatives Jimmy Gomez, Rashida Tlaib, Joaquin Castro, Andy Kim, Jamaal Bowman, Rob Menendez, Dan Goldman, Eric Swalwell, Ruben Gallego, Colin Allred, Mike Levin, Josh Harder and Raul Ruiz.

Since then, the Dads Caucus has grown to 33 members and become one of the most active caucuses on Capitol Hill. The caucus holds monthly meetings, roundtable discussions, press conferences, and leads letters and endorses legislation.

The mission of the Dads Caucus is to provide a forum for members of Congress to advocate for legislation that supports mothers, fathers and children.

BILL ENDORSEMENTS

BLACK MATERNAL HEALTH MOMNIBUS

The Dads Caucus endorsed U.S. Rep. Lauren Underwood's Black Maternal Health Momnibus, which is a package of 13 bills to address the Black maternal health crisis through historic investments that comprehensively address every driver of maternal mortality, morbidity, and disparities in the United States. The United States has the highest maternal mortality rate of any high-income country and significant disparities in outcomes—and the crisis is only worsening: the maternal mortality rate in 2021 was 89 percent higher than the rate in 2018.

AMERICAN FAMILY ACT

The Dads Caucus endorsed U.S. Rep. Rosa DeLauro's American Family Act, which will make the expanded and improved Child Tax Credit (CTC) permanent. The expanded CTC that was included in the American Rescue Plan Act reached more than 61 million children and lifted nearly 4 million out of poverty in 2021 alone. It was the largest tax cut for working families in generations. The monthly delivery of the CTC payments helped families get ahead and provided financial security.
