



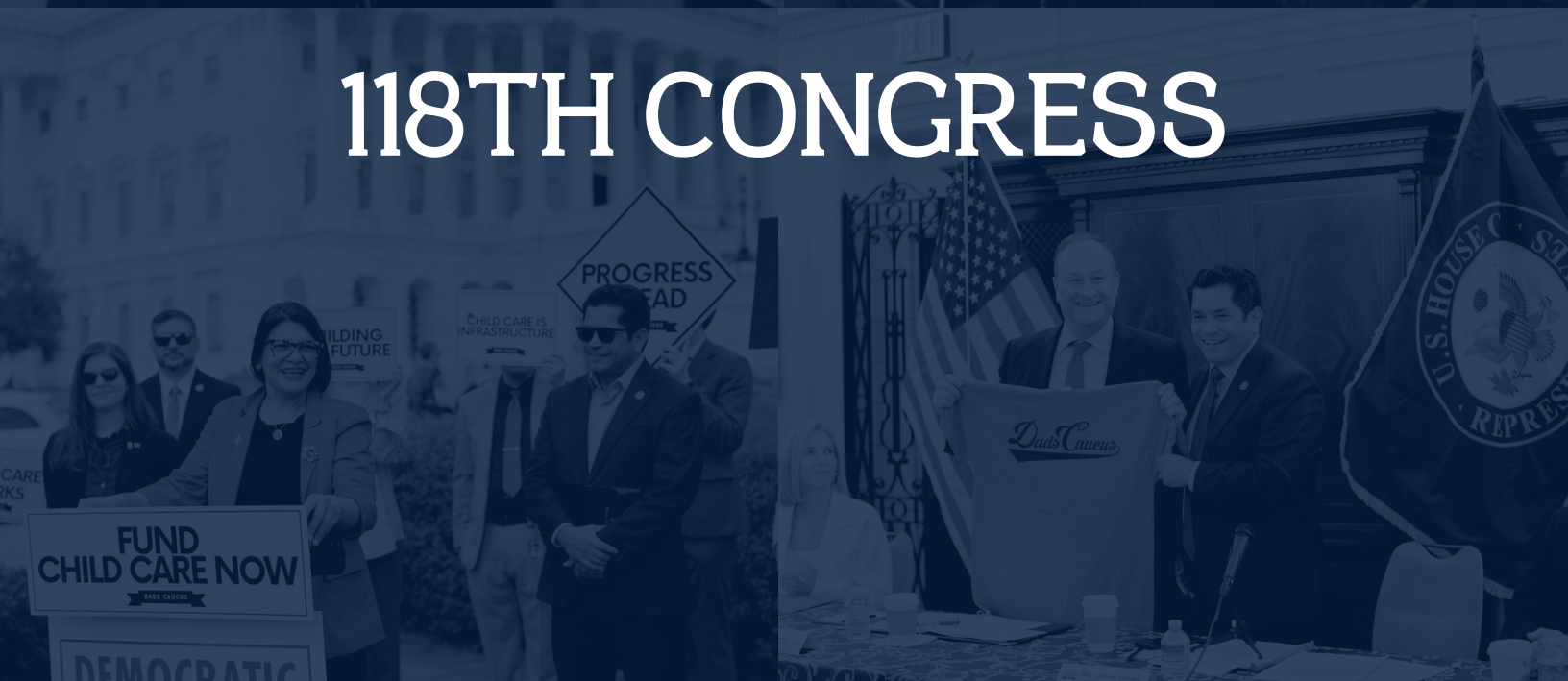

The Congressional Dads Caucus was founded on January 26, 2023 by Representatives Jimmy Gomez, Rashida Tlaib, Joaquin Castro, Andy Kim, Jamaal Bowman, Rob Menendez, Dan Goldman, Eric Swalwell, Ruben Gallego, Colin Allred, Mike Levin, Josh Harder and Raul Ruiz.

Since then, the Dads Caucus has grown to 35 members and become one of the most active caucuses on Capitol Hill. The caucus holds monthly meetings, roundtable discussions and press conferences, and leads letters and endorses legislation.

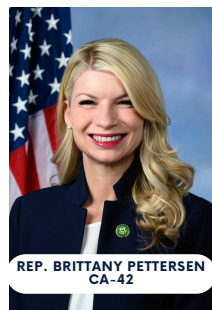
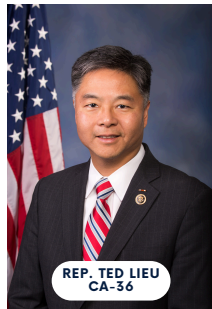
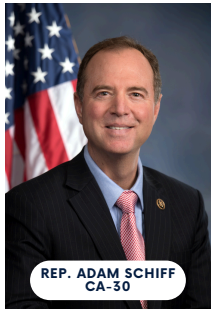
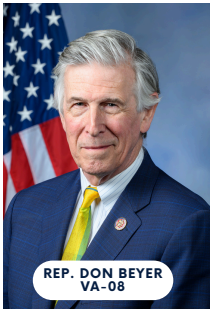
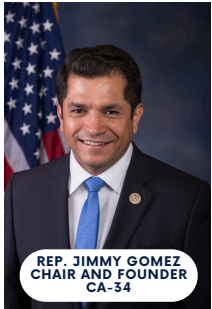
The mission of the Dads Caucus is to provide a forum for members of Congress to advocate for legislation that supports mothers, fathers and children.

- Supporting policies that reduce poverty and help working parents

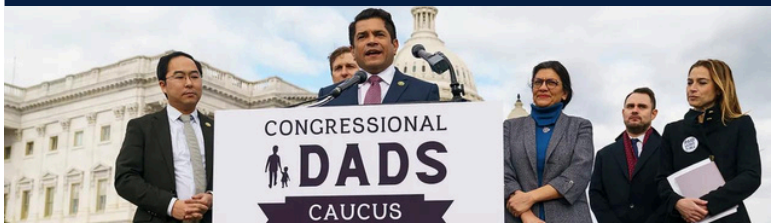

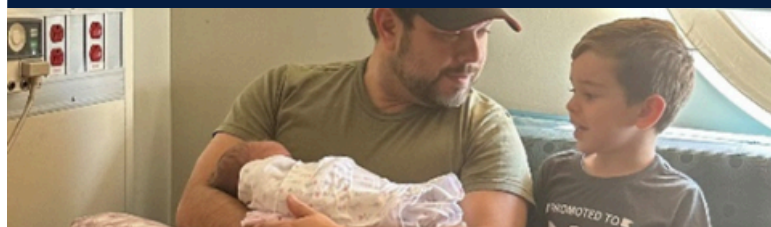


Deluzio Highlights Child Care Center at Pittsburgh Airport as a Model

The Congressional Dads Caucus is demanding answers from Food and Drug Administration commissioner Robert Califf about what the agency is doing to guarantee food safety for young children and ensure snacks like applesauce are not being tainted as was the case last year.

BILL ENDORSEMENTS



BLACK MATERNAL HEALTH MOMNIBUS

The Dads Caucus endorsed U.S. Rep. Lauren Underwood's Black Maternal Health Momnibus Act, which is a package of 13 bills to address the Black maternal health crisis through historic investments that comprehensively address every driver of maternal mortality, morbidity, and disparities in the United States. The United States has the highest maternal mortality rate of any high-income country and significant disparities in outcomes—and the crisis is only worsening: the maternal mortality rate in 2021 was 89 percent higher than the rate in 2018.



AMERICAN FAMILY ACT

The Dads Caucus endorsed U.S. Rep. Rosa DeLauro's American Family Act, which will make the expanded and improved Child Tax Credit (CTC) permanent. The expanded CTC that was included in the American Rescue Plan Act reached more than 61 million children and lifted nearly 4 million out of poverty in 2021 alone. It was the largest tax cut for working families in generations. The monthly delivery of the CTC payments helped families get ahead and provided financial security.



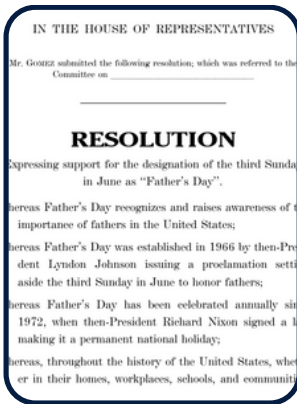
ADVANCING TOWARD IMPACT AID FULL FUNDING ACT

The Dads Caucus endorsed U.S. Rep. Mike Levin's Advancing Toward Impact Aid Full Funding Act, which will support public school districts containing federal lands. Federal lands are tax exempt and public schools rely on the taxes of their district for funding. These under-funded schools can be supplemented through Impact Aid funding, which supports more than 1,100 school districts and over 10 million students. Despite national dependency, Congress has not fully funded Impact Aid since 1969. This bill introduces a five-year plan to fund Impact Aid and help schools provide better resources for our children.

FATHER'S DAY RESOLUTION

The Dads Caucus introduced a Father's Day resolution honoring dads and calling for support of our three key pillars: paid leave, affordable and accessible child care, and the expanded Child Tax Credit. The resolution was announced at a press conference days ahead of Father's Day.



LETTERS

ACCESS TO CHANGING TABLES

The Dads Caucus wrote to the House Administration Committee urging expanded access to diaper changing tables in restrooms on Capitol Hill. "Every staff member, Member of Congress, and visitor to our Congressional offices deserves basic access to a place to change their child's diaper," said Chair Gomez.

LEAD-TAINTED CHILDREN'S FOOD

After reports of lead-tainted applesauce and Lunchables being served to children across the country, the Dads Caucus wrote to the Food and Drug Administration (FDA), urging them to explain how lead-tainted children's food was allowed to be sold to parents and fed to kids, and to provide a clear path forward to ensure it never happens again.

CHILD CARE FUNDING CLIFF

The Dads Caucus joined the Democratic Women's Caucus to call on House leadership to avoid a child care funding cliff and pass emergency and permanent funding. "The child care crisis affects all parents and is not just about families' economic success and stability, but our country's as well," wrote the members.

DATA ON PATERNAL HEALTH

The Dads Caucus wrote to U.S. Secretary for Health and Human Services Xavier Becerra urging federal regulators to collect data on fathers' public health in early parenthood and the impact of paternal health on infants, mothers and families.

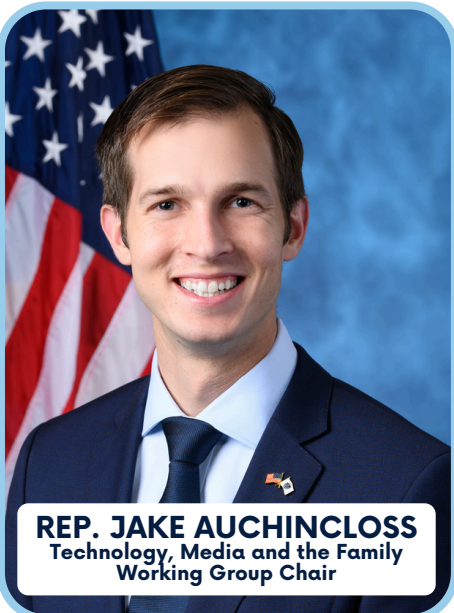
